

Cambrensis choir and orchestra under the inspirational direction of Kelvin Thomas will be providing the backbone for a rehearsal and performance of Handel's oratorio. The event is open to all who would like to sing Messiah from Scratch. There is no charge to perform but it would be helpful if participants came to St Cadoc's Church, Raglan with their own copy of the vocal score. The rehearsals take place from 2.30pm on Saturday and the performance will be at 7.30. Entry to the evening performance will be charged at £5.

St Cadoc's Church will also host the superb flute and harp duo Catherine Handley and Eluned Pierce. Taking place at 3pm on Sunday 11th their programme includes well-known works by Mozart, Debussy and Ravel as well as lesser-known works from Lauber, Mouquet and Blake. Both Catherine and Eluned regularly perform with many of the world's top orchestras.


John Wetton & Geoff Downes are undoubtably two of the
